The more assets that young people have, the less likely they are to engage in a wide range of high-risk behaviors and the more likely they are to thrive and reach their full potential. For over 100 years, the Big Brothers Big Sisters movement has been championing the health and wellbeing of youth. We step in to help prevent the physical and mental effects of adverse childhood experiences. We ensure that youth ages 6 to 18 are supported by caring adults, helping them to do better in life and build resilience — physically, mentally, socially, emotionally and academically.

Supportive Relationships + Skill-Building Opportunities + Positive Experiences = Resilience

I would like conclude by Thanking our amazing, dedicated and flexible staff. We would not be where we are today without them! This year we have grown so much with the success of grants, that we have doubled our staff! Double the staff, means double the reach. Each staff member within the Agency, and within The Little Shop go the extra mile to make sure we reach the need listed above. I continue to feel truly fortunate to have such a hands-on Board of Directors supporting the work that we do; your vision and guidance continues to help us grow and help us make a difference — Thank You! Finally, Thank You to our incredible crew of volunteers (71 in 2023 to be exact) for giving their time and energy to help tie it all together. Every role within this Agency compliments each other. I want you all to realize the impact that your time gives.

When I asked Brooklyn how the 2 of us have grown during our time together, she said, "we've got older and celebrated birthdays together":) I think the longer we've known each other, it's easier to talk about different things. We have shared many conversations about her family and mine.




